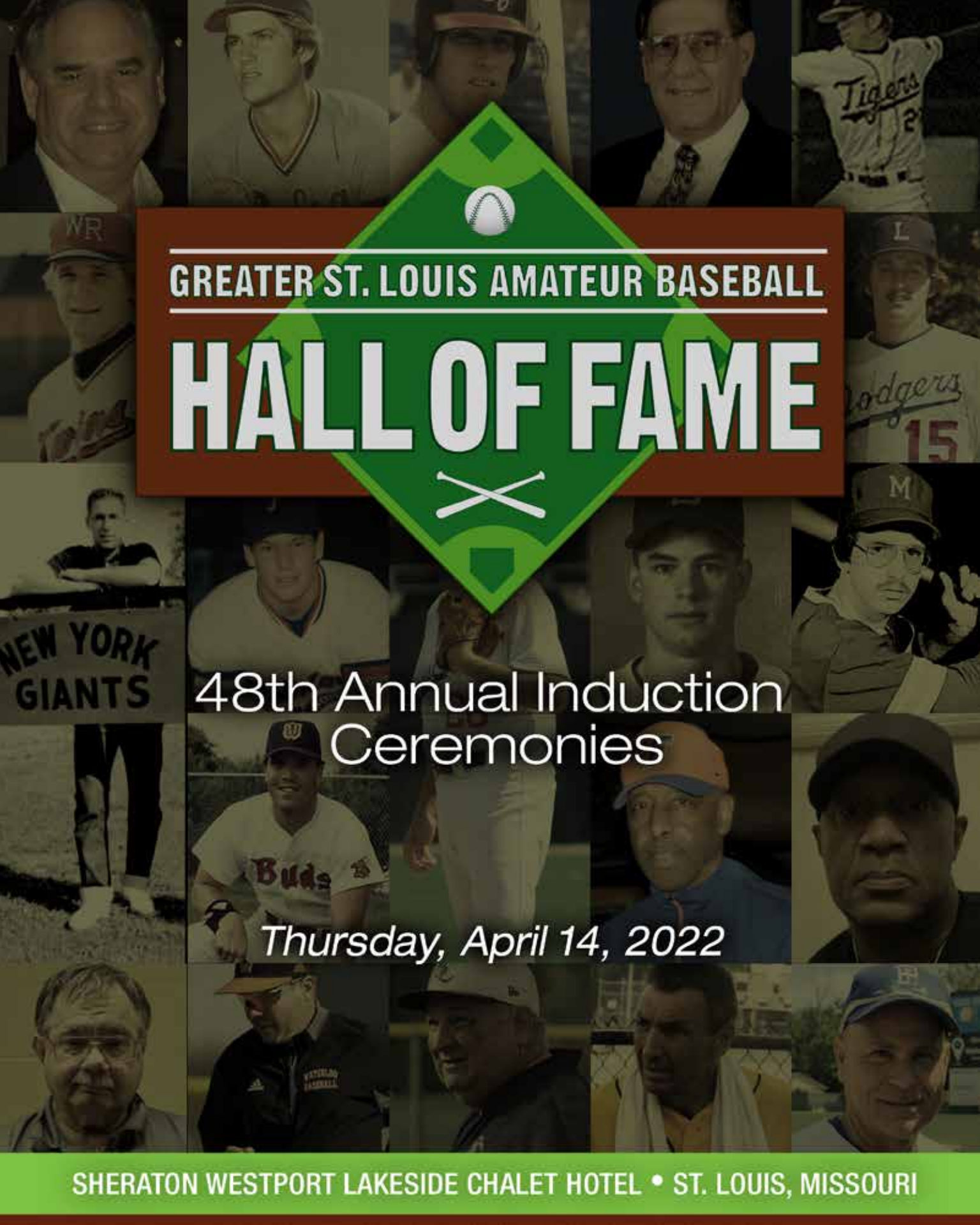

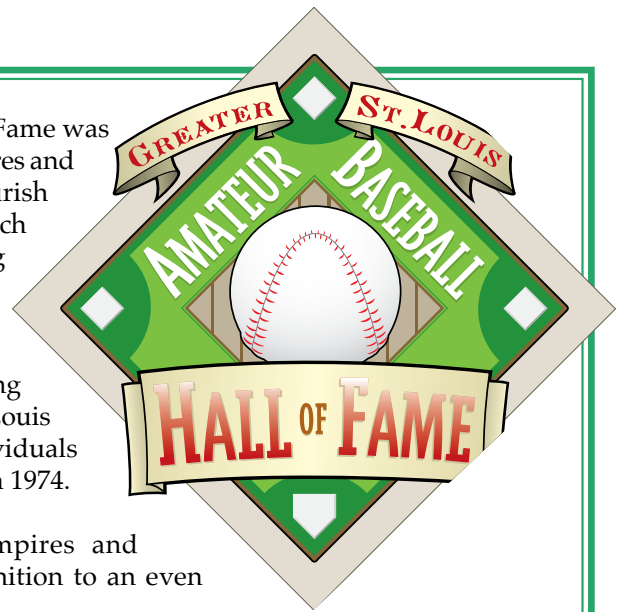

The Greater St. Louis Amateur Baseball Hall of Fame was founded in 1973 to honor those players, coaches, umpires and contributors who have helped amateur baseball flourish in the Gateway City. The STL ABHOF celebrates the rich history of St. Louis amateur baseball by recognizing those individuals who have contributed on the field as an outstanding player, coach or umpire or off the field as an organizer or contributor. The STL ABHOF is a not-for-profit organization dedicated to promoting and recognizing individuals who have excelled in St. Louis amateur baseball during their career. Over 800 individuals have been honored since the first class of inductees in 1974.



Along with honoring past players, coaches, umpires and contributors, the STL ABHOF has expanded recognition to an even wider playing field:

In 1995, the Rising Star Award was born. This award honors high school baseball players and their coaches for outstanding play.

In 2001, the STL ABHOF created the Bob Broeg Award to honor a high school baseball coach who excels as a teacher, coach and mentor for their respective high school team.

The Bob Burnes Lifetime Achievement Award, established in 2004, honors a player from the Greater St. Louis Area who has achieved success at the professional level.

In 2012 the STL ABHOF created the Jack Buck Media Award, which is presented to a distinguished member of the St. Louis media who has promoted, reported, broadcast, provided analysis or play-by-play about the game of baseball in a professional manner during their career.

In 2018, the inaugural STL ABHOF Legacy Award was created to recognize a person or organization that has a proven track record of dedication to the great game of baseball in the Greater St. Louis area. This award recognizes people and /or organizations at all levels of competition – professional, amateur and youth baseball. In 2020, the award was renamed the J. Kim Tucci Legacy award in honor of the late owner of The Pasta House Company.

ABHOF ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

To be eligible for induction, candidates must have the following minimum qualifications for consideration:

- Have reached the age of 40
- Have participated in an STL ABHOF approved level of amateur baseball for at least eight (8) seasons after high school. Each college season and summer season counts individually. Minor league playing time will be accepted. Appearances in the major leagues shall be limited to 120 or fewer AB's and five (5) or fewer pitching appearances.
- Have participated for at least one (1) year in the Greater St. Louis area.

JACOB TURNER



A dominant right-handed pitcher, Turner played in the Major Leagues from 2011 to 2018. A top prospect, he was chosen by the Detroit Tigers in the first round of the 2009 Major League draft. He made his Major League debut on July 30, 2011 for the Tigers. He pitched for the Miami Marlins from 2012 to 2014. He was on the Chicago Cubs in 2014 and the Chicago White Sox in 2016. He pitched for the Washington Nationals in 2017. In 2018, Turner pitched once again for the Miami Marlins and the Detroit Tigers. In 2019, he played for the Kia Tigers in South Korea.

Turner grew up in St. Charles and played for Westminster Christian Academy. When he was a senior in high school, he was reaching a speed of 98 miles per hour with his fast ball. His record was 20-4 at Westminster. Todd Worrell and Mike Matheny were two of his instructors at Westminster.

Before the 2009 MLB Draft, Turner had committed to pitch for the University of North Carolina.

ED CHARD

Chard was the head baseball coach at Hancock High School from 1968 to 1971, and head baseball coach at Mehlville High School from 1972 to 1985. During that time, his teams won five district championships and three sectional titles. He guided the Mehlville Panthers to the Missouri State Tournament three years in a row from 1982 to 1984. Three Post-Dispatch Players of the Year were on Chard's Mehlville team.

Chard was the Athletic Director of the Lemay Baseball Association from 1968 to 1985. He was in charge of Heine Meine Field. He also served as a coach and manager in the Heine Meine Semi-Pro League. From 1958 to 1966, he was manager of the Century Sporting Goods team. From 1960 to 1966, he was a coach for VFW Post 6137. From 1968 to 1978, he managed the Southside Baseball Club in the Heine Meine Semi-Pro League. He was both a coach and a manager for the Johnny Mac Baseball Club from 1982 to 1991.

Chard is a past president of the Missouri High School Baseball Coaches Association. He was director of the Missouri State Tournament five times when it was played at Heine Meine Field.

He was an outfielder for Bayless High School from 1957 to 1959.

Chard became an Assistant Principal at Mehlville High School in 1985. From 1990 to 2000, he was the head principal at Oakville High School.

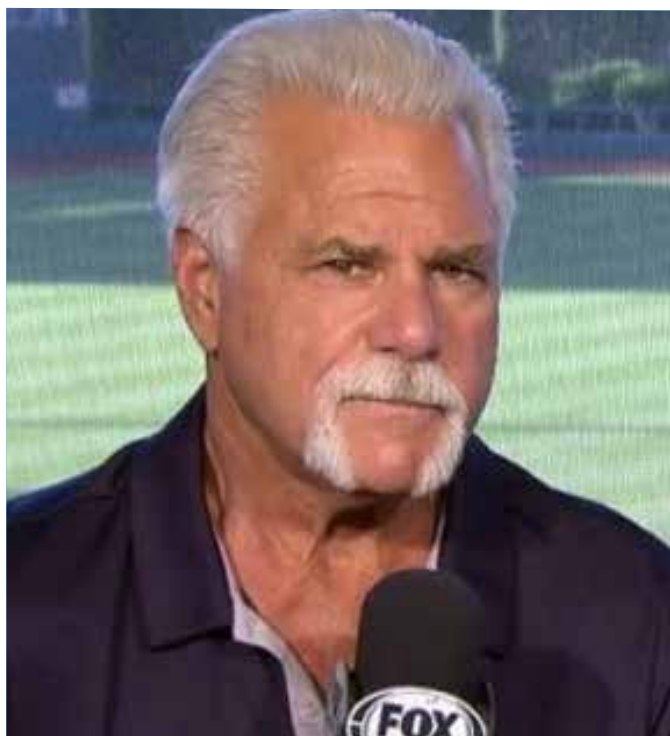


THE JACK BUCK MEDIA AWARD

AL HRABOSKY



A fan favorite, Hrabosky pitched for the Cardinals from 1970 to 1977. He led the National League in saves in 1975 with 22 on his way to winning The Sporting News National League Fireman of the Year Award. That year, he had a career high in wins, posting a 13-3 record with an ERA of 1.67.

Hrabosky pitched for the Kansas City Royals in 1978 and 1979, and the Atlanta Braves from 1980 to 1982.

He played both baseball and football at Savanna High School in Anaheim, California. He was originally drafted by the Minnesota Twins in 1967 but did not sign with the club. Two years later, the

Cardinals made him their first round draft choice.

Hrabosky has provided color commentary for Cardinal games since 1985, and has been with Bally Sports Midwest since 1997. He also hosted his own radio show on KFNS 590AM in St. Louis. He is also a broadcaster on the Cardinals Radio Network.

GARRETT BAUER (40)

He was an overpowering left-handed pitcher who played in the farm system of the Arizona Diamondbacks for two seasons. He signed with the Diamondbacks in 2004 and pitched in the Pioneer League for the Missoula Osprey. In 2005, he was a pitcher in the Northwest League for the Yakima Bears. From 2006 to 2008, he played minor league ball for the Rockford Riverhawks. He made the all-star team every year. Rockford won the Frontier League championship in 2006.

Bauer starred for Missouri Baptist College before signing with the Diamondbacks. He later coached baseball at Missouri Baptist, helping the 2008 team advance to the super regional tournament. He helped develop the career of Clayton Dill who was drafted by the Washington Nationals in 2008.

Bauer was the pitching coach at St. Louis Community College from 2013 to 2017. From 2017 to 2021, he was the pitching coach of the Southern Illinois Miners in Marion, Illinois.

Bauer was a dominant pitcher at Lafayette High School in the late 1990s.



HOWARD "HANK" BIERMAN (88)

Bierman was a hard-hitting outfielder and third baseman who could play every position. In 1951, he played for the Appleton Papermakers in the farm system of the St. Louis Browns. In 1952, he was with the Oshkosh Giants, a farm team of the New York Giants. He also played minor league baseball for the Mt. Vernon Kings and Jackson Generals. In 1955, he played minor league baseball in Texas for Plainview, Abilene, and Midland.

From 1953 to 1955, he played service ball at Fort Leonard Wood. He led the league in hitting in 1953.

Bierman starred for Soldan High School in the late 1940s. He played American Legion Ball in St. Louis from 1946 to 1951. He was scouted by the New York Yankees and was offered a tryout.

He began his baseball career in the Khoury League in 1945.

In 1952, Bierman caught batting practice for the St. Louis Cardinals and St. Louis Browns. He has coached and umpired baseball in California where he has lived for over 40 years.



SCOTT CEPICKY (55)

He was a catcher, first baseman, and outfielder who played in the farm system of the Chicago White Sox from 1989 to 1993, reaching the Triple A level in 1993 with the Nashville Sounds. He played for the Double A Birmingham Barons in 1992 and 1993. The Barons manager was Terry Francona. Cepicky started out with the Gulf Coast League White Sox in 1989. He played for the South Bend White Sox in 1990, winning the Midwest League batting title. He was named Florida State League MVP in 1991 with the Sarasota White Sox. He wrapped up his minor league career in 1994 with the Double A Nashville Xpress, a farm team of the Minnesota Twins.

In 1992, Cepicky was ranked as a top prospect by Baseball America Magazine.

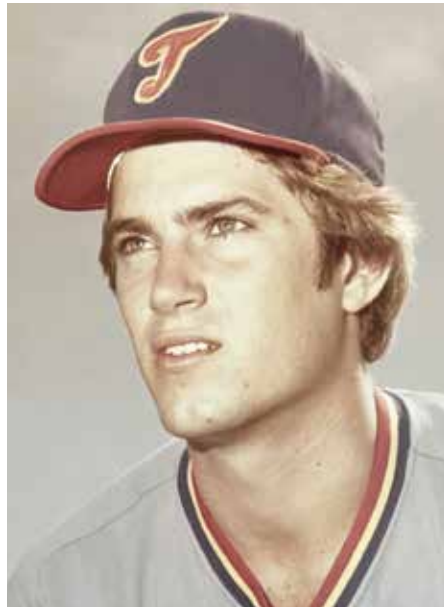
In 1992 and 1993, he played in the Venezuelan Winter League under manager Terry Francona. In 1992, Cepicky was named MVP after leading the league in RBIs and home runs.

Cepicky starred for Vianney High School in the early 1980s. In 1984, he won the American Legion batting title and was named MVP.

In the late 1980s, he was the top hitter for the University of Wisconsin at Madison. He was named to the All-Big Ten team in 1988 and 1989.

He won three MVP awards. He also played on the Wisconsin football team. He was a punter who was scouted by the Kansas City Chiefs, Minnesota Vikings, and Cincinnati Bengals.

Cepicky played in the Mon-Clair League for the Waterloo Buds and also the St. Louis Yankees. In 2000, he coached in a college summer league in Atlanta.



MARK FORCHEE (63)

A powerful right-handed pitcher, Forchee signed with the St. Louis Cardinals in 1982 and played for their farm teams in Johnson City, Tennessee and Gastonia, North Carolina.

He pitched for Lindbergh High School from 1973 to 1976.

He was a member of Ric Lessmann's dominant Meramec Community College team in 1977 and 1978. Forchee was a starting pitcher on the 1978 Meramec team that finished third at the JUCO national tournament in Grand Junction, Colorado.

He pitched for Tulsa University in 1979 and 1980. During those same years, he also pitched for the Royals in the St. Louis Metro Collegiate League.

Forchee was a pitcher for the Valmeyer Lakers in 1981, and then again from 1983 to 1989. He was selected to the Mon-Clair League All-Star Team in 1981. In 1984, he was named MVP of the Valmeyer Mid-Summer Classic Tournament.

In 2014, Forchee was inducted into the Mon-Clair Baseball League Hall of Fame.



JOHN HERZING (75)

He was a strong left-handed pitcher who was drafted by four Major League teams. The Cincinnati Reds chose him in 1964, the New York Mets in 1966, the Detroit Tigers in 1967, and the St. Louis Cardinals in 1969.

Herzing pitched for Washington University-St. Louis from 1965 to 1969, setting school records for most career strikeouts and best single season ERA. He is number two on the all-time career ERA list at WU-STL. He was named his team's Most Valuable Player in 1969. He was a College Athletic Conference All-Star in 1965, 1968, and 1969. As a freshman, he struck out 14 batters to win a conference championship game. He was inducted into the Washington University-St. Louis Hall of Fame in 1999.

Herzing pitched for Bayless High School in the early 1960s, and is in that school's athletic hall of fame.

He played semi-pro ball for L&P Sales from 1965 to 1967, and then again in 1969. He made the all-star team every year. In 1967, he led L&P Sales to a 15-0 victory over the Colt 45s, striking out 20 batters and only allowing six hits.

In 1968, Herzing played semi-pro ball in Mexico, Missouri and was selected to the All-State team by the National Baseball Congress. He played semi-pro ball in Dallas in 1970.

Herzing pitched for the Southwest Kiwanis from 1955 to 1960, and Waterson Boys Club in 1961. He was selected to the Khoury League All-Star Team each year.



KEN KLUMP (61)

He was an infielder and pitcher who was drafted by the Minnesota Twins in 1982 and played in their farm system until 1986. He pitched for the Wisconsin Rapids Twins in 1982 and 1983, and the Orlando Twins from 1984 to 1986.

Klump switched from shortstop to starting pitcher in 1981 when he was a sophomore at SIU Carbondale. That year, he pitched a two-hit shutout against nationally ranked Wichita State in the Missouri Valley Conference championship series. In 1982, he led the Salukis pitching staff in complete games and strikeouts.

In 1980, Klump played for the West County Royals in the St. Louis Metro Collegiate League.

In 1981, he was with the Grand Rapids Sullivans, a Michigan team affiliated with the National Baseball Congress.

Klump was a shortstop for De Smet High School in the late 1970s. In 1979, he was named to the All-Metro team. That same year, he received honorable mention as an All-Metro quarterback.

In 1978 and 1979, he led Thoman-Boothe to back-to-back appearances at the Missouri American Legion state tournament.

He has worked as a youth instructor for the SIU Carbondale baseball team. From 2015 to 2018, he managed the American Legion Post 556 baseball team. He coached little league baseball for the Chesterfield Athletic Association from 2006 to 2014.



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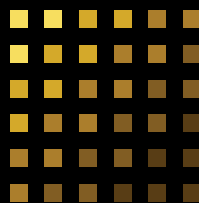
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LEO "SKIP" MANN (64)

He was a shortstop, second baseman, and outfielder who was drafted by the Los Angeles Dodgers in 1979 and spent three years in their farm system. In 1979, he was the starting shortstop on the Lethbridge Dodgers team that won the Pioneer League championship. He also played for Dodger farm teams in Lodi, California and Vero Beach, Florida. In May 1980, he was Player of the Month for the Vero Beach Dodgers.

Mann was the starting shortstop for the University of Missouri at St. Louis when he was drafted by the Dodgers. He played three seasons at UMSL, earning Honorable Mention as an All-American in 1978 and 1979. He was named to the All-Region Second Team both years. As a freshman on the 1977 team, he helped the UMSL Rivermen advance to the NCAA Division Two College World Series. The Rivermen advanced to the NCAA Regionals all three years he was on the team. His career batting average at UMSL was .320 with 133 hits, 26 doubles, ten triples, and three home runs. He had 86 RBIs. He scored 100 runs in 125 games. He ranks fifth in UMSL history with 68 stolen bases, and is tenth all time in triples with ten. He tied a school record for hits in a game with five against

McKendree College on April 5, 1979. He was co-captain of his UMSL team in 1979. In 2010, Mann was inducted into the UMSL Sports Hall of Fame.

Mann played for CBC High School from 1972 to 1975. During the summer of 1977, he played for the Wareham Gatemen in the Cape Cod League. During the summer of 1978, he was on the Staunton Braves in the Virginia Valley League.



EVAN PRATTE (53)

A switch-hitting infielder, Pratte was drafted by the Boston Red Sox in 1990 and the Detroit Tigers in 1991. He played five seasons in the Tigers farm system, advancing to the Double A level with the London Tigers, the Trenton Thunder, and the Jacksonville Suns. He was also on the Niagara Falls Rapids, the Fayetteville Generals, and the Lakeland Tigers.

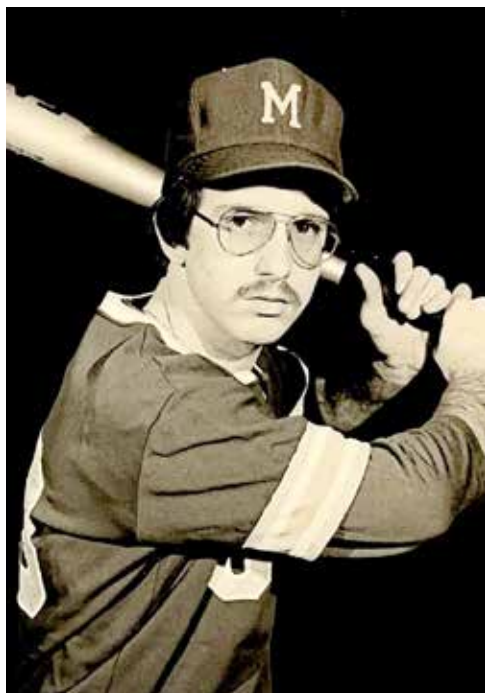
Pratte signed with the Tigers while he was playing for Southwest Missouri State University now called Missouri State University. At Southwest Missouri State, he was selected to the All-Region team in 1991, and he was named All-Conference in 1990 and 1991. His Bears team won the conference championship three times. He played for Southwest Missouri from 1988 to 1991, and set twelve career records that have not been broken. He was team captain his junior and senior year. Pratte was inducted into the Missouri State University Athletic Hall of Fame in 2008.

In the late 1980s, Pratte starred for Lafayette High School and the Ballwin American Legion team.

In 1997, he was the manager of the Nevada Griffons in Nevada, Missouri. His team won the Jawhawk League Championship and finished second at the NBC tournament in Wichita, Kansas. He coached baseball at Southwest Missouri State University from 1996 to 1998.

In 1998, Pratte became the assistant baseball coach at the University of Missouri at Columbia. He was the director of baseball operations at Mizzou from 2010 to 2018. The Tigers won numerous championships during his 21 years at Mizzou.

He also served as an assistant baseball coach at St. Louis University from 2019 to 2021. He now serves as Director of High School Baseball Operations for the Rawlings Tigers in St. Louis.



GREG READY (64)

A left-handed outfielder, Ready played for the University of Missouri at St. Louis from 1976 to 1979. During those four years, his UMSL team never had a losing season, advancing to the NCAA Regionals every year. In 1977, the UMSL Rivermen played in the NCAA Division Two College World Series. That year, Ready was an Honorable Mention All-American. In 1978, he received First Team All-American honors. He was named to the All-Region team in 1977 and 1978. His career batting average at UMSL was .405, third highest in the school's history. He still holds UMSL single game records for most hits and most steals. He also holds UMSL career records for most hits with 228 and most steals with 122. Ready coached the UMSL team in the 1990s. He was inducted into the UMSL Sports Hall of Fame in 2002.

In the summer of 1977, he played in the Cape Cod League for the Wareham Gatemen.

In 1978, Ready played for the Staunton Braves in the Virginia Valley League. He won the North Central Region batting championship, and led the league in stolen bases.

He played in the St. Louis County League for the Fenton Vets in 1979, and the St. Louis Gateway in 1980.



TERRY REPP (1962-2015)

A good-hitting infielder, Repp was drafted by the Milwaukee Brewers in 1982 while he was playing for Meramec Community College. His batting average was .399 for Meramec in 1982. He only struck out once in 167 plate appearances. That year, he was named to the All-District team and the All-Midwest team. He also played for Meramec in 1983.

Repp was Rookie of the Year in 1981 at Southwest Missouri State University. His batting average was .432.

He was a third baseman for Vianney High School from 1977 to 1980. He had a batting average of .391 in 1980 when he was selected to the Post-Dispatch All-Metro, All-District, and All-Conference teams. That same year, he helped Crestwood advance to the American Legion World Series in Ely, Minnesota. He was captain of his Crestwood team and the leading hitter.

In 1981 and 1982, Repp played for the West County Royals in the St. Louis Metro Collegiate League. In 1982, he led the Royals with a .362 batting average.

From 1983 to 1987, he played for the Solotar Pointers in the CYC Senior Major League. In 1986, he led the Pointers with a .423 batting average, 80 hits, 17 doubles, and 8 game winning RBIs. He was the Most Valuable Player on the Pointers team in 1985 and 1986. He was selected to the all-star team in 1985, 1986, and 1987. Repp spent five seasons with the Solotar Pointers and is ranked in the Top Ten in batting average, hits, doubles, triples, and RBIs.

Repp died on August 6, 2015 at the age of 53.

MIKE ROY (58)

He was a right-handed first baseman who signed with the Minnesota Twins in 1985, and played for their farm team in Elizabethton, Tennessee.

Roy signed with the Twins after playing for Western Kentucky University in the Sun Belt Conference. He was named to the All-Conference team in 1984 and 1985. He is ranked in the Top Ten for home runs in a single season at Western Kentucky.

He was a Junior College All-American in 1983 at Belleville Area College. He played for McKendree College in 1981 and 1982.

Roy played for Waterloo High School from 1978 to 1981. He was on the Freeburg American Legion team in 1979, and the Waterloo American Legion team in 1980 and 1981.

From 1980 to 1993, he was a standout first baseman for the Waterloo Buds under coach Vern Moehrs. Roy helped the Buds win numerous championships. He was selected to multiple Mon-Clair League all-star teams.

In 1984, Roy played in the Virginia Valley League for the Staunton Braves.

From 2001 to 2015, he coached the Chesterfield Mudcats to 462 victories and 158 losses. His team won numerous tournaments and a Missouri state championship.



DON STOVALL (67)

Stovall was a catcher in the farm system of the Minnesota Twins in the 1970s. He played for the Elizabethton Twins in Elizabethton, Tennessee.

From 1980 to 1994, he caught for the Colt 45s in the Mon-Clair League, helping his team win the St. Clair Division title in 1990. During his 15 years with the Colt 45s, his composite batting average was well over .300.

He also played for East St. Louis in the Mon-Clair League, helping his team finish in second place in 1979 and 1981. In 1991, Stovall and his son DaRond Stovall both played on the East St. Louis team. DaRond went on to play in the Major Leagues with the Montreal Expos.

In the 1970s, Stovall was a catcher for East St. Louis High School and Greenville College. He played in the Tandy League in the 1990s.

Stovall is still active as a player in the St. Louis Baseball Forever League. He has been a catcher for the Pirates, Wildcats, Badgers, Sharks, and Game Face. He has coached high school baseball for the past 25 years. In 2020, Stovall was inducted into the National Semi-Pro Baseball Hall of Fame.

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DAVID TODD (62)

He was a second baseman, outfielder, and pitcher for University City High School. He played right field for Ladue High School, graduating in 1977.

Todd was a letterman for two years at Northeast Missouri State University now called Truman State University. He was the starting center fielder in 1980, and the starting right fielder in 1981. During those two years, he didn't make any errors, and was only caught stealing once. His composite batting average was well over .300. He was scouted by the Cincinnati Reds.

Todd was the starting right fielder for 20 years on the St. Louis Wildcats semi-pro team from 1981 to 2001. He was also a coach and manager for the Wildcats.

He also played semi-pro ball in the Tandy League, Coal Belt League, Black Ball League, and the St. Louis North County League. He played on numerous championship teams throughout his baseball career, and was selected to many all-star teams.

Todd coached baseball at Normandy High School for eight years. He was a physical education teacher for 30 years in the Normandy School District.

In 2020, Todd was inducted into the National Semi-Pro Baseball Hall of Fame.



WILLIAM BECHER (70)

A 1969 graduate of Riverview Gardens High School, Becher was the head baseball coach at that school from 2000 to 2005.

In 1987, Becher was one of the founding members of SLABA (St. Louis Amateur Baseball Association). He has coached the American National Eagles SLABA team from 2003 until the present day, and has served as the team's director since 2007.

Becher coached the Johnny Mac Thunder from 1979 to 2002, compiling more wins than any other coach in the history of the St. Louis Amateur Baseball Association. He won 3 SLABA Coach of the Year Awards. He won the 2013 Muskopf-Sears Award for his service and commitment to SLABA. His teams competed in tournaments against some of the best amateur teams from across the country.

Becher coached over 200 young men who went on play college baseball, and 14 of his players advanced to the professional ranks.

CHARLES MEEKER (67)

Meeker was the head baseball coach at St. Charles High School for 27 years from 1992 to 2018, leading his teams to five Final Four appearances at the Missouri State Tournament. The Pirates finished second in 2005 and third in 1993. Meeker was the assistant baseball coach at St. Charles High School for six years from 1986 to 1991. During his 33 years as a high school baseball coach, Meeker conducted numerous baseball camps to teach the fundamentals of the game.

He also coached basketball at St. Charles High School.

Meeker grew up in Mediapolis, Iowa and played baseball at Mediapolis High School. He was a right-handed pitcher. From 1973 to 1978, he pitched for Northeast Missouri State University.



MARK VOGEL (53)

He has been the head baseball coach at Waterloo High School since 1992, winning over 535 games. His teams won numerous conference, regional, and sectional championships, advancing twice to the Illinois State Tournament. In 2011, he was named Metro East High School Coach of the Year.

Vogel has been the head baseball coach at Waterloo Junior High School since 1991, winning well over 500 games. His teams have won numerous championships.

A 1986 graduate of Waterloo High School, Vogel played second base for the Waterloo Bulldogs. He was a second baseman for Kaskaskia College from 1986 to 1988. He was the leading hitter on the Kaskaskia team in 1986. Vogel played for the University of Northern Iowa from 1988 to 1991.

He was a second baseman in the Mon-Clair League for 16 years from 1986 to 2002. Thirteen of those years were spent with the Waterloo Buds under coach Vern Moehrs. Vogel played for the Buds in 1987 and then again from 1991 to 2002. He was with the Valmeyer Lakers in 1986, and Belleville from 1988 to 1990. During his 16 years in the Mon-Clair League, his composite batting average was .317.

Vogel has been an assistant coach for the Waterloo Millers in the Mon-Clair League since 2015. He was inducted into the Mon-Clair Baseball League Hall of Fame in 2019.

Vogel has coached baseball in Waterloo for over 32 years, beginning in 1991 with the Waterloo American Legion team.

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CHARLIE PILZ (80)

A hard-hitting third baseman, Pilz starred for William Jewell College in 1962 and 1963, helping his team win the league championship both years. In 1963, he led the league in batting with a .442 average. His slugging percentage was .863. He was named to the All-Conference team, and he became the first All-American in the history of William Jewell College. In 2002, he was inducted into the William Jewell Athletic Hall of Fame.

In the late 1950s, Pilz was a third baseman for McKinley High School, and he was scouted by professional teams. Jerry Buchek was one of his teammates.

Pilz played third base for the Aubuchon-Dennison American Legion team. He began his baseball career in the Khoury League with Kessler Motors and Ziegenhein.

In 1971, Pilz helped form the Ladue Baseball League, and he was one of the original managers. He remained with Ladue until 1984 when he became a manager for teams in the Creve Coeur Athletic Association and the Ellisville Athletic Association.

In 1987, Pilz became the manager of the Brentwood American Legion team. During his 22 years with Brentwood, his teams won three American Legion District titles. In 1999, he received the Larry Guelker Memorial Award as American Legion Coach of the Year. Pilz was known as the "Brentwood Factor" because of his tremendous success at Goff-Moll American Legion Post 101. He turned the Brentwood team into a contender. Many of his players advanced to the college ranks and the minor leagues. Pilz left the Brentwood American Legion team in 2009, and coached youth teams in the St. Louis area until 2014.



JACK SCANIO (62)

Scanio coached baseball at Hazelwood West High School for 28 years from 1984 to 2012. He was the varsity pitching coach from 1984 to 2000, and the head freshman baseball coach from 2000 to 2012. His teams won numerous championships. He helped develop the pitching skills of Kyle McClelland and David Phelps who both played Major League Baseball.

Scanio is a 1978 graduate of Hazelwood Central High School where he was a standout pitcher on the Hazelwood Hawks team all four years he attended the school. He was named All-Conference in 1978 when he set a school record for lowest ERA, a record which still stands. In 1978, he won nine games and only lost one.

He pitched for Crowder College in 1979 and 1980. During those same two years, he was a pitcher and outfielder in the St. Louis Metro Collegiate League.

Scanio was a pitcher and infielder at Missouri Baptist College from 1981 to 1983. He was also an assistant coach his senior year.

He is still active as a player in the St. Louis Men's Senior Baseball League. He has been a pitcher for the Bud Light team since 2012. During that same time, he was a pitcher and infielder in the Roy Hobbs League, helping the Midwest Pirates win the national title in

2015. He has participated in national tournaments in Phoenix and Fort Myers.

Scanio is still active as a pitching instructor in the St. Louis area, and has conducted summer baseball camps for over 25 years.

SLABA's founding principles of promoting sportsmanship, fellowship, and the development of youth through baseball-related activities year-round are still the basis of the league today.

Preparing to celebrate its 35th anniversary, the league now boasts 17 member organizations in Missouri and Illinois. In 2022, this includes nearly 50 teams and more than 600 players competing in the 12U through 18U age levels, with league and playoff championships as well as all-star games part of a nearly three-month season.

SLABA offers maximum exposure to top-notch competition as its teams participate in select tournaments across the Midwest each summer.

The league also seeks all available opportunities to connect its players with the region's college coaches.
