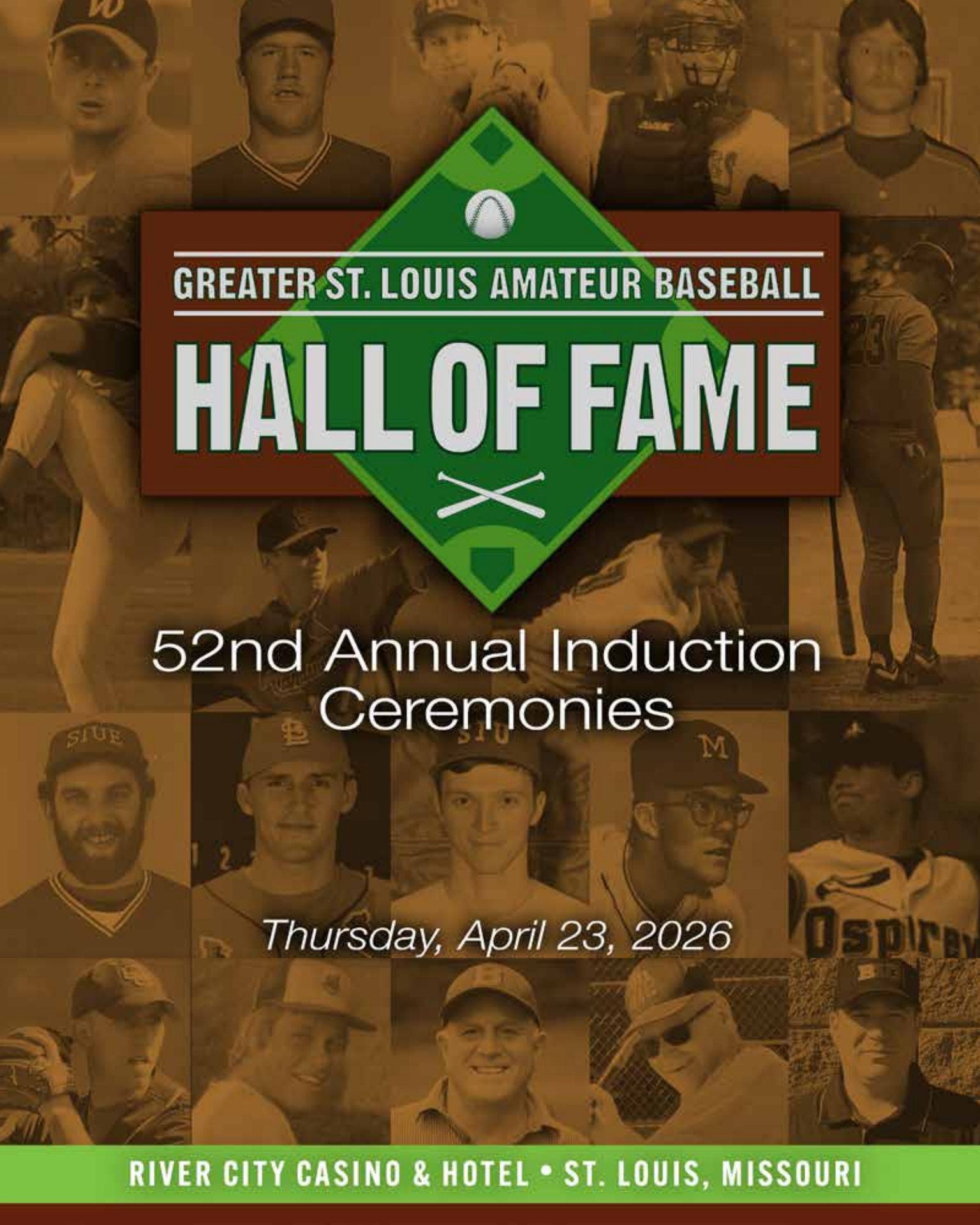

The Greater St. Louis Amateur Baseball Hall of Fame was founded in 1973 to honor those players, coaches, umpires and contributors who have helped amateur baseball flourish in the Gateway City. The STL ABHOF celebrates the rich history of St. Louis amateur baseball by recognizing those individuals who have contributed on the field as an outstanding player, coach or umpire or off the field as an organizer or contributor. The STL ABHOF is a not-for-profit organization dedicated to promoting and recognizing individuals who have excelled in St. Louis amateur baseball during their career. Over 800 individuals have been honored since the first class of inductees in 1974.

Along with honoring past players, coaches, umpires and contributors, the STL ABHOF has expanded recognition to an even wider playing field:

In 1995, the Rising Star Award was born. This award honors high school baseball players and their coaches for outstanding play.

In 2001, the STL ABHOF created the Bob Broeg Award to honor a high school baseball coach who excels as a teacher, coach and mentor for their respective high school team.

The Bob Burnes Lifetime Achievement Award, established in 2004, honors a player from the Greater St. Louis Area who has achieved success at the professional level.

In 2012 the STL ABHOF created the Jack Buck Media Award, which is presented to a distinguished member of the St. Louis media who has promoted, reported, broadcast, provided analysis or play-by-play about the game of baseball in a professional manner during their career.

In 2018, the inaugural STL ABHOF Legacy Award was created to recognize a person or organization that has a proven track record of dedication to the great game of baseball in the Greater St. Louis area. This award recognizes people and /or organizations at all levels of competition – professional, amateur and youth baseball. In 2020, the award was renamed the J. Kim Tucci Legacy award in honor of the late owner of The Pasta House Company.

ABHOF ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:
To be eligible for induction, candidates must have the following minimum qualifications for consideration:

- Have reached the age of 40
- Have participated in an STL ABHOF approved level of amateur baseball for at least eight (8) seasons after high school. Each college season and summer season counts individually. Minor league playing time will be accepted. Appearances in the major leagues shall be limited to 120 or fewer AB's and five (5) or fewer pitching appearances.
- Have participated for at least one (1) year in the Greater St. Louis area.

Bob Ramsey, a two-time local Emmy award winner and a five-time Missouri Sportscaster of the Year Award winner, is our emcee tonight for the 52nd St. Louis Amateur Baseball Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony. He was presented the Jack Buck Award by the Greater STL Amateur Baseball Hall of Fame in 2020. He was inducted into the St. Louis Sports Hall of Fame in 2026.

The St. Louis University Hall of Famer started his long career broadcasting LouisianaTech basketball. He gave Tech player Karl Malone, a future NBA star, his nickname "The Mailman."

Ramsey has over 30 years on the call for St. Louis University Billikens basketball. He is the longest tenured play-by-play man in the history of St. Louis University. Ramsey also broadcast Cardinal baseball on Fox Sports Midwest and on the St. Louis Cardinals Radio Network.

ROSS DETWILER



Known as a versatile left-handed hurler, Ross Detwiler pitched in 14 big league seasons before making his final appearance in 2022. The Washington Nationals made him their first pick (sixth overall) in the 2007 June MLB Draft. He pitched in just nine minor league games before making his MLB debut in September of 2007. He pitched his first seven seasons in the Washington Nationals organization.

He was known for his high-90s fastball and an excellent sinker that induced a high percentage of ground balls. During his career he made 100 starts and collected 30 wins and over 500 strikeouts for ten MLB teams including Washington, Texas, Atlanta, Cleveland, Oakland, Seattle, Chicago (AL), Miami, San Diego and Cincinnati. His ability to start and relieve made him a valuable member of any pitching staff. He also pitched for Team USA in the 2013 World Baseball Classic earning a save in the U.S. victory over Italy.

He starred at Wentzville - Holt HS where he was named GAC Player of the Year after his senior season. He also pitched for Wentzville Legion Post 323 before moving on to Missouri State University where he pitched for three seasons and became ace of the staff while earning several Missouri Valley Conference honors.

CONRAD (BABE) CHAMPION



He was the head baseball coach at Granite City High School from 1960 to 1979. In 2006, the main baseball field at Granite City High School was named in his honor.

Champion played left field on the 1948 Granite City High School team that won the Illinois state championship. Granite City defeated New Athens to win the title. Whitey Herzog was the center fielder on the New Athens team. Champion was selected to the All-Tournament team as a sophomore. He coached the Granite City High School team in 1951 when he was a senior in his fifth year due to a lengthy illness in 1949-1950.

From 1970 to 1979, he was the head coach of the Granite City American Legion team. In 1976 and 1977, Granite City finished second at the Illinois American Legion state tournament.

From 1952 to 1956, Champion played left field and first base in the Madison County League in Illinois. During that same time, he also played for Shurtleff College in Alton.

Other teams he played for include: Fleishman's, the Steelworkers, and the Pontoon Athletic Club.

He also played fast-pitch softball in St. Louis for Thurner's Bar and Kutis.

From 1980 to 1987, Champion was a professional baseball scout for the Philadelphia Phillies and Kansas City Royals. He covered the states of Missouri and Illinois.

Champion was a college umpire for many years. In 1963, he umpired NCAA playoff games.

He was a high school and college basketball referee for 37 years, and a college football referee for fifteen years.

Champion is a charter member of the Granite City Sports Hall of Fame.

In 2016, he was named "Citizen of the Year" by the Chamber of Commerce of Southwestern Madison County in Illinois.

In 2017, Champion was inducted into the St. Louis Amateur Baseball Hall of Fame at the same time as his son Keith Champion.

He is the lead baseball writer at the St. Louis Post-Dispatch and has been covering the St. Louis Cardinals for over 22 years. He joined the Post-Dispatch in September of 2001, writing about the St. Louis Blues. He moved to the baseball beat in July of 2004, covering the Cardinals exclusively. Goold has been the lead baseball writer at the Post-Dispatch since November of 2012.

Before coming to the Post-Dispatch, he was a sportswriter for the New Orleans Times-Picayune and the Denver Rocky Mountain News.

Goold is an award-winning journalist, recognized for his feature writing and investigative reporting on baseball, hockey, and college athletics. He has received numerous accolades, including four Associated Press Sports Editors Awards, an Associated Press Media Editors Award, and a Lee Enterprises President's Award.

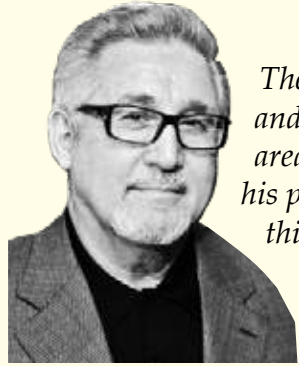
His work often focuses on in-depth reporting, analysis, and breaking news about the St. Louis Cardinals. He's known for his inside access and insightful columns.

Goold has contributed to Baseball America and the MLB Network. He has appeared on TV sports shows like "The Fast Lane" on Fox Sports Midwest. He is a frequent guest on several St. Louis "sports talk" radio stations. He hosts "The Best Podcast in Baseball" which covers the latest news about the Cardinals.

Goold was president of the Baseball Writers Association of America in 2016 after serving as vice president in 2015. In 2012, he wrote the book "100 Things Cardinals Fans Should Know & Do Before They Die" which is a comprehensive guide to the history of the St. Louis Cardinals. Stan Musial wrote the forward to the book, adding a nostalgic touch.

Goold grew up in Elgin, Illinois and he is a 1997 graduate of the University of Missouri School of Journalism.

In September of 2019, he helped save a man's life at Busch Stadium by doing CPR. Goold was trained in CPR as a former lifeguard and Eagle Scout. The incident happened right before the Cardinals clinched the division championship against the Chicago Cubs on September 29, 2019. A videographer collapsed in the Cubs dugout after suffering a heart attack and then a stroke. Goold was right there and he was the first link in the chain of survival.



J. KIM TUCCI LEGACY AWARD

The J. Kim Tucci Legacy Award was created in 2018 to honor individuals and organizations who are outstanding supporters of baseball in the St. Louis area. It is named for the late Kim Tucci of The Pasta House Company to honor his prolific support of amateur baseball and the city of St. Louis. Each year this award recognizes a person and their organization that has a proven track record of dedication to the great game of baseball at all levels of competition – professional, amateur and youth baseball in the Greater St. Louis area. CARDINALS CARE



Cardinals Care is the community foundation of the St. Louis Cardinals, dedicated to improving the lives of children in the St. Louis area. Established in 1997, it focuses on helping children in under-resourced neighborhoods. Since its inception, Cardinals Care has invested over 34 million dollars into community programs, providing essential resources and support to children and families in need.

A Redbird Rookies youth baseball and softball league was created for children in impoverished neighborhoods. Building and renovating ballfields is a top priority.

Financial support is provided to local nonprofits that work with children. The Cardinals Care Family Room at the Grove Ronald McDonald House opened in June of 2024. Cardinals Care funded the baseball-themed space where parents can gather with their children who are receiving treatment at local hospitals. Cardinals Care donated 200,000 dollars to the St. Louis

County Library to fund a Cardinals Care Bookmobile. There are over 5,000 items with a special shelf devoted to Cardinal-themed books. Thousands of students will benefit from the bookmobile. Last year, Cardinals Care provided a partnership grant of 500,000 dollars for an Eye Thrive Mobile Vision Clinic which travels to schools and community centers, benefiting children in need of vision care.

Cardinals Care provides health screenings, educational programs, and scholarships to support the health and education of children.

Cardinals Care raises money through various events and initiatives, including their popular Winter Warm-up fundraiser, where fans meet players, coaches, and alumni while exploring the Cardinals Hall of Fame and Museum. The Annual Fun Run features a family-friendly course through the streets of downtown St. Louis, finishing on Clark Street, followed by a memorable victory lap around the warning track inside Busch Stadium. The fun starts at Ballpark Village with a pre-race warm-up. There are weekly auctions, both online and in-person, featuring autographed items and memorabilia. There are 50/50 Raffles to raise money during home games at Busch Stadium. Cardinals Care works with local organizations to support children in the St. Louis community. Donations are accepted through the Cardinals Care website and other channels.

Cardinals Care works with the Joe Torre Safe At Home Foundation to provide resources to traumatized youth, helping them enjoy secure, violence-free lives. The many accomplishments of Cardinals Care reflect their commitment to improving the lives of children in the St. Louis area.

2026 CLASS OF INDUCTEES



COREY BLACKWELL (49)

He was a strong right-handed pitcher from New Athens, Illinois who starred in the Mon-Clair League for the Waterloo Buds/Millers from 1996 to 2013. During his eighteen years in the Mon-Clair League, he won 147 games and lost only 33, setting a league record for wins. He won six ERA titles, more than any other pitcher in the history of the Mon-Clair League. In 2000, he was the Most Valuable Player on his Waterloo Buds team. In 2005, he was named MVP of the Valmeyer Tournament. He was a perennial all-star who was named to the Mon-Clair League all-star team every year. Blackwell was on teams that won seven Mon-Clair League championships, five Valmeyer Tournament championships, and twelve Monroe Division championships. He pitched three no-hitters during his Mon-Clair League career. He has coached youth teams in the Mon-Clair League for the past eight years. In 2016, Blackwell was inducted into the Mon-Clair Baseball League Hall of Fame.

From 1996 to 1998, Blackwell played semi-pro ball for the Sauget Wizards and was named team MVP in 1998. In 1999, he signed a professional contract and pitched in the Frontier League for the River City Rascals under manager Jack Clark.

Blackwell pitched for Belleville Area College in 1996 and 1997 with a record of 20 wins and only three losses. In 1997, he was named MVP of his team. In 1998, he was a pitcher for the University of Arkansas at Little Rock. In 1999, he pitched for Southern Illinois University at Edwardsville.

Blackwell is a proud supporter of the Mon-Clair League which is known for developing talented players and fostering a strong sense of community. The Mon-Clair League provides a positive, supportive environment for baseball players in Southern Illinois.



DAREN DEPEW (60)

He was a hard-hitting catcher who in 1988 played in the farm system of the Texas Rangers. He was on the Boise Hawks, the Rangers farm team in the Northwest League.

In 1984 and 1985, DePew was a catcher for the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign.

In 1986 and 1987, he caught for Southern Illinois University at Edwardsville. His senior year, he batted .382 and was named MVP and All-Region. His team won 40 games and lost 15 with one tie. He caught every inning of all 56 games.

From 1989 to 1998, he was a player-manager for Granite City in the Mon-Clair League. He was selected to the all-star team all ten years. His teams won three Mon-Clair League championships and three Valmeyer Tournaments. He was named Manager of the Year three times in the Mon-Clair League. In 2001, DePew was inducted into the Mon-Clair Baseball League Hall of Fame.

DePew coached baseball at Granite City High School for 21 years.

He was the assistant baseball coach for eleven years and the head baseball coach for ten years. He was also a teacher. A 1983 graduate of Granite City High, DePew is currently principal of the school.

He coached four years at the Gators Baseball Academy in St. Louis. He also coached the St. Louis Pirates traveling team four years.



KENT HENDRICKSON (70)

He was a right-handed pitcher on the 1977 SIU-Edwardsville team that advanced to the College World Series. The 1977 team was inducted into the SIU-Edwardsville Hall of Fame. Hendrickson also pitched for the SIUE Cougars in 1978 when he was named the Most Valuable Player and All-Conference. His Earned Run Average that year was 2.21.

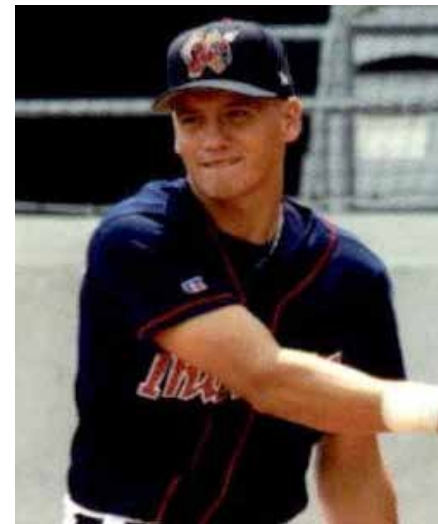
From 1974 to 1976, Hendrickson was a pitcher on the strong Florissant Valley Community College team coached by Larry Adams. During those three years, the Norsemen were a dominant JUCO team in Missouri.

In the early 1970s, Hendrickson pitched for St. Thomas Aquinas High School.

In 1974, he was on the Maryland Heights American Legion team. From 1978 to 1980, he played for the St. Louis Gateways, helping his team advance to the NBC tournament in Wichita all

three years. In 1978, the Gateways finished fourth at the NBC tournament.

In the late 1970s and early 1980s, Hendrickson pitched in the St. Louis County League for Kutis, Giesler-Jorgen, McBride & Sons, and the Sotolar Pointers. He was on several County League championship teams.



BEN MARGALSKI (46)

A prolific catcher, Margalski was drafted by the Anaheim Angels in 1997 while playing for Northwest High School in Cedar Hill, Missouri. In 2001, he was drafted by the Philadelphia Phillies in the 16th round out of Missouri State University in Springfield. He spent two seasons in the Phillies farm system. In 2001, he played with the Batavia Muckdogs and then with the Lakewood Blue Claws in 2002. In 2003, he signed with the Cleveland Indians and played for the Kinston Indians. In 2003, he also played in the farm system of the Montreal Expos, catching for the Savannah Sand Gnats. Margalski remained in the Expos farm system in 2004 with the Brevard County Manatees in the Florida State League. In 2004, he also caught for the legendary Stockton Ports, a minor league affiliate of the Texas Rangers. Margalski wrapped up his minor league career in 2004 with the

Oklahoma City Red Hawks.

In 2005, he caught for the Gateway Grizzlies in the Frontier League under manager Danny Cox. Margalski was named All-League and he was selected to the Frontier League all-star team.

In 1998 and 1999, he played for Southwestern Illinois College in Belleville under long-time coach Neil Fiala. In 2000 and 2001, Margalski was a standout catcher for Missouri State University in Springfield. In 2001, he led his team to the Missouri Valley Conference Championship, and he was selected as "College Player of the Year" by the Midwest Scouts Association.

Margalski has been coaching baseball in the St. Louis area for over twenty years. He is presently a head coach for the US Nationals baseball organization in the St. Louis area. He founded Team Missouri Baseball in 2013. He has coached the Rawlings Prospects team in St. Louis. He has coached three Major League players, eighteen Major League draft picks, and 173 NCAA players.



ANDY SCHUTZENHOFER (45)

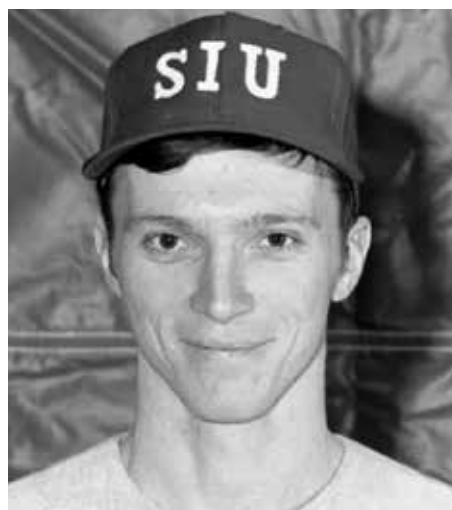
He was a left-handed first baseman who played in the farm system of the St. Louis Cardinals from 2003 to 2005. In 2003, he started out with the Johnson City Cardinals in the Appalachian League and then moved to the Palm Beach Cardinals in the Florida State League. He also played for the Palm Beach Cardinals in 2004 and 2005. In 2005, he advanced to the Double A level with the Springfield Cardinals in the Texas League. Schutzenhofer consistently hit over .300 in the minor leagues.

From 2000 to 2003, he was a first baseman for the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, setting several school records. He ranks third in all-time career hits with 132 and sixth in all-time career RBIs with 173. His on base percentage was .449, which is fourth best in the history of the Fighting Illini. In 2000, Schutzenhofer set an all-time freshman record with 87 hits and 63 RBIs. He helped the Fighting Illini win the Big Ten Tournament with seven home runs, 63 RBIs, and a .375 average. He was named a Freshman All-American. He was selected to the All-Big Ten first

team and the ABCA Midwest Region first team. In 2001, he led his Fighting Illini team with a .392 batting average. He was selected to the All-Big Ten second team in 2001 and 2002. He was chosen for the All-Big Ten first team in 2003. He excelled in athletics and academics. In 2003, he received the Big Ten's Award of Honor for the Outstanding Scholar-Athlete.

Schutzenhofer played for several summer collegiate baseball teams. In 2000, he was an all-star first baseman with the Alton Bluff City Bombers in the Central Illinois Collegiate League. In 2001, he was selected to the all-star team while playing for the Waterloo Bucks in the Northwoods Summer Collegiate League in Iowa. In 2002, he was with the Kenai Peninsula Oilers in the Alaska Summer Collegiate Baseball League.

From 1996 to 1999, he was a first baseman for Belleville East High School, and his father Dennis was head coach of the team. Their team advanced to the Illinois state tournament in 1996.



DENNIS SCHUTZENHOFER (76)

Schutzenhofer, often referred to as "Shooter," began his long playing career as a shortstop for Belleville West High School from 1965 to 1967. He was a shortstop and second baseman for the Belleville Hilgards Post 58 team from 1966 to 1968. He is in the Belleville Hilgards American Legion Hall of Fame.

In 1968 and 1969, he played shortstop for Belleville Area College. In 1970 and 1971, he played second base for SIU-Edwardsville. He coached the team as a graduate assistant from 1972 to 1974.

Schutzenhofer was a second baseman for Millstadt in the Mon-Clair League from 1968 to 1985. He was on numerous championship teams. In 2014, he was inducted into the Mon-Clair Baseball League Hall of Fame.

Although he was an infielder during his playing career, Schutzenhofer became the batting practice pitcher for the St. Louis Cardinals from 2000 to 2019. He was a full-time member of the Cardinal staff with the title "Coaching Assistant to Baseball Operations." He wore a Cardinal uniform and traveled with the team. The name Schutzenhofer is the longest name

to ever appear on the back of a Cardinal uniform.

Schutzenhofer spent over thirty years coaching baseball in the Belleville School District. He coached at both Belleville East and Belleville West High Schools. He coached his son Andy at Belleville East from 1996 to 1999. Their team advanced to the Illinois state tournament in 1996. Schutzenhofer was named High School Coach of the Year in 1996 and 1999. He received the St. Louis Sports Commission's Redbird Award in 1996, 1999, and 2000. In 2006, he retired from teaching chemistry and coaching baseball in the Belleville School District. That's when he became a full-time member of the Cardinal staff.

Schutzenhofer was the head coach of the Fairview Heights American Legion team from 1973 to 1977 and then again from 1990 to 2000. He was named the American Legion District 22 Coach of the Year in 1996 and 1999. He was an umpire from 1982 to 2008, working high school, college, American Legion, CICL, and Mon-Clair League games.



GARY STARR (88)

A versatile infielder, Starr played in the Chicago Cubs farm system in 1960 and 1961. In 1960, he was on Cub minor league teams in Lancaster, Pennsylvania and Carlsbad, New Mexico. In 1961, he played for the Chiefs, a Cub farm team in Wenatchee, Washington.

Starr was an infielder for Belleville Township High School from 1953 to 1956, and his team won the Illinois state championship in 1954.

He also played for the prestigious Belleville Hilgards Post 58 team that won the Illinois American Legion state championship in 1954. He is a member of the Belleville Hilgards American Legion Hall of Fame.

Starr received a baseball scholarship to the University of Missouri at Columbia and played for the Mizzou Tigers baseball team from 1957 to 1960. His team finished second at the College World Series in 1958. The Tigers lost in the final round to the University of Southern California Trojans. Starr was captain of the 1960 team. He set several team records at the University of Missouri

at Columbia. He also received a football scholarship to Mizzou, and he was a quarterback on the Tigers team.

He spent four seasons in the Ban Johnson League with the St. Louis Buick Dealers team, and four seasons in the St. Louis County League with the Sievers Tavern team. During those eight years, he was selected to many all-star teams.

In the 1960s, Starr was the head baseball coach at Joplin Memorial High School in Joplin, Missouri. He guided his team to numerous championships.

In 1987, Starr coached the Berkeley High School football team to the Missouri state championship.



TODD STEIN (44)

Stein was a left-handed pitcher who was drafted by the Arizona Diamondbacks in 2004, and he spent two years in their farm system. In 2004, he pitched for the Missoula Osprey in the Pioneer League. In 2005, he was with the South Bend Silver Hawks, helping his team win the Midwest League championship.

In 2006, he played for the Gateway Grizzlies in the Frontier League under manager Danny Cox. From 2001 to 2004, Stein pitched in the Missouri Valley Conference for Illinois State University in Normal.

During the summer of 2001, he was a pitcher for the Twin City Stars, a team representing the twin cities of Bloomington and Normal in the Central Illinois Collegiate League.

During the summer of 2000, he played for St. Charles in the St. Louis Metro Collegiate League. During the summers of 2002 and 2003, he pitched for Creve Coeur in the St. Louis Metro Collegiate League. He was named to the Metro League all-star

team all three years.

Stein was an outstanding pitcher at Ladue Horton Watkins High School from 1997 to 2000. His senior year, he pitched a no-hitter against Brentwood High School. He set a school record with sixteen strikeouts in the 6-1 victory. He only walked three batters, and the one run allowed was unearned.

He was named to four American Legion all-star teams while pitching for the Goff-Moll Post 101 team in Brentwood. Stein is currently the owner and manager of the St. Louis Recruits Baseball Club which has approximately thirty youth teams for ages eight to seventeen.

BRAD STONE (41)

An outstanding right-handed pitcher, Stone was drafted by the Houston Astros in 2005 and the next year he was drafted by the Florida Marlins. He played in the Marlins farm system from 2006 to 2010. He began his five-year minor league career with the Marlins farm team in Greensboro, North Carolina. He pitched for the Greensboro Grasshoppers from 2006 to 2008. In 2006, he was also on the Jamestown Jammers in Jamestown, New York. In 2008 and 2009, he pitched for the Jupiter Hammerheads in the Florida State League. In 2009, he advanced to the Triple A level with the New Orleans Zephyrs. He also pitched for the Zephyrs in 2010. In 2009 and 2010, he was a pitcher for the Jacksonville Suns in the Southern League. His team won the league championship both years. Stone wrapped up his minor league career in 2010 with the Gulf Coast League Marlins. He continued to play professional

baseball in 2011 with two independent teams – the Gateway Grizzlies and the Sioux Falls Pheasants.

Stone pitched for CBC High School and received a baseball scholarship to Quincy College where he played from 2004 to 2006. He was then drafted by the Florida Marlins.

Stone was a pitching coach in the St. Louis area from 2003 to 2023. He coached baseball at Bishop DuBourg High School, St. Mary's High School, and Webster University.



DAVE WARNECKE (70)

He was a relief pitcher and shortstop who played in the farm system of the Cleveland Indians from 1978 to 1980. In 1978 and 1979, he pitched for the Waterloo Indians in Waterloo, Iowa. In 1978, he also played for the Batavia Trojans in Batavia, New York. In 1980, he was on the Chattanooga Lookouts in the Southern League.

Warnecke was playing for the McKendree University Bearcats in 1978 when he was drafted by the Cleveland Indians. He was the first McKendree baseball player ever selected in the Major League draft. He was a four-year starter on the Bearcats team from 1975 to 1978. His career batting average at McKendree was .348, including a career-best .396 as a junior. He was a dominant force on the mound, cementing his status as one of the top pitchers in the league. Warnecke was the Most Valuable

Player on the Bearcats team in 1978. That year, he was named to the All-State and All-District teams. He was also selected to the Missouri-Illinois Collegiate League all-star team. From 1980 to 1984, he played for the renowned Aviston Aces in the Clinton County League. He is in the Clinton County League Hall of Fame.

In the early 1970s, Warnecke pitched for Central High School in Breese, Illinois. He is in the Central High School Hall of Fame. In the 1990s, he coached youth baseball teams in his hometown of Aviston, Illinois.



ANDY KATZMAN (59)

Katzman has been a cornerstone of the baseball program at John Burroughs High School since 1989 as both a head and assistant coach. During those 37 years, he has over 500 wins with three state championships, seven Final Four appearances, and eleven conference championships. Katzman was the assistant baseball coach from 1989 to 2000, and the Burroughs Bombers won the Missouri state championship in 1991. He became head coach in 2001 and the next year he guided the Bombers to the state championship. He was named Missouri Coach of the Year in 2002. He was head coach for 18 years until 2019. He has been the assistant baseball coach at John Burroughs since 2020. The Bombers won the state championship in 2023.

Katzman attended John Burroughs High School from 1981 to 1985, and he was a left-handed pitcher on the Bombers squad all

four years. In 1985, he was the winning pitcher when the Bombers defeated Licking High School to win the Missouri state championship.

Katzman has been part of all four state championship victories in the history of baseball at John Burroughs High School. For over five decades, Katzman has been “Mr. John Burroughs Baseball” and last year the main baseball field at John Burroughs High School was renamed Katzman Park.

In 1985 and 1986, Katzman was a pitcher for Wake Forest University in Winston-Salem North Carolina. In 1987 and 1988, he pitched for St. Louis University where he graduated with a degree in political science.

A consummate role model, he has positively influenced hundreds of young men to be better ballplayers and even better human beings.



PETE SCHUMACHER (86)

Schumacher was the Secretary-Treasurer of the Clinton County Baseball League for 50 years from 1965 to 2015. In 2004, he was an inaugural inductee into the Clinton County Baseball Hall of Fame.

Since 1979, Schumacher has been a top administrator for the Trenton American Legion Baseball program in Trenton, Illinois. He was also a manager and coach. In 1991, he was inducted into the Trenton American Legion Baseball Hall of Fame.

He was the baseball coordinator for the city of Trenton from 1962 to 2019. The main baseball diamond at Trenton City Park was dedicated as Pete Schumacher Field in 2001.

In the 1950s, he attended St. Henry's Preparatory Seminary in Belleville and Chaminade Catholic High School in St. Louis.

He is a 1970 graduate of Belleville Area College now called Southwestern Illinois College.

From 1970 to 1972, he attended Southern Illinois University at Edwardsville. Schumacher has loved baseball since he was six years old, and he is still an avid supporter and dedicated contributor.

MIKE WEINSTEIN (42)

He has been an umpire since 1995, working at all levels from the minor leagues to high school and everything in between.

Weinstein began umpiring when he was twelve years old. He was with the Creve Coeur Athletic Association from 1995 to 2001. He started umpiring high school games while still a student at Parkway Central High School.

From 1998 to 2002, he was a member of the Greater St. Louis Association of Umpires, working high school, junior college, and college games.

In 2003, Weinstein umpired in Iowa in the Northwoods Summer Collegiate League.

He was a minor league umpire from 2004 to 2008, working games in the Midwest League and the Carolina League. Many of the players would later advance to the Major Leagues. In 2005, he umpired the Midwest League all-star game. In 2006, he worked the Carolina League all-star game. In 2007, he was assigned to the

Carolina League championship series.

From 2013 to 2022, Weinstein umpired in the Frontier League, an independent professional baseball league. In 2018, he was named Frontier League Umpire of the Year.

In 2013, he joined the prestigious Collegiate Baseball Umpires Alliance, and he is still an active umpire with that organization, working NCAA games in several different conferences like the Big Ten and the Missouri Valley Conference. He also umpires junior college and NAIA games.

In 2002, he attended the Southern Umpires Camp, a training program for umpires in Atlanta, and he received the top award.

For many years, Weinstein has mentored and trained younger umpires coming up through the ranks.

St. Louis is regularly called “the best baseball town in America.”

But that descriptor is not solely due to the success of its professional baseball teams. What truly makes St. Louis baseball so special is its rich history at the amateur level— a history that dates back to July 9, 1860, when two amateur teams, the Cyclones and the Morning Stars met in the region’s first documented organized baseball game played at Fairgrounds Park, in north St. Louis at Grand and Natural Bridge Avenues.

Amateur baseball is the very root of the game we play, love, and watch. It’s where all baseball players begin. Everyone is an amateur the first time they pop a mitt or take a swing. How many youngsters playing in organized baseball realize that the Khoury League was founded in St. Louis in 1934 and today still calls its National Organization’s home St. Louis? Within this baseball greatness, there was a time when more players were in the Major Leagues from one St. Louis high school than any other in America. Few recognize the significant role that a St. Louis African American amateur league played as a turnstile to the Negro Leagues in the days prior to the integration of Major League Baseball. Beyond high school, there were decades where the region’s teams were regular finalist in the American Legion National Championship games. And for those who could not give up their love of the game, senior amateur baseball has flourished for decades at a level as competitive as many Minor League affiliates. It is this history, the moments, and players that make St. Louis amateur baseball so special. To honor their accomplishments, the Greater St. Louis Amateur Baseball Hall of Fame was established in 1973 to recognize and preserve the memories of those players, coaches, umpires, and contributors who have helped amateur baseball flourish in the Gateway City. Every year since 1974, an induction dinner and ceremony has been held to recognize the newest class of honorees.



Don Gabbert, Founder and

Tonight is the 50th Anniversary and Induction Ceremony of the Greater St. Louis Amateur Baseball Hall of Fame. The HOF was organized in July 1973, when Don Gabbert initiated discussions to honor those individuals that have made the region’s amateur baseball history so special. Over the next month, Gabbert formed a special committee consisting of himself, Bob Burnes, Gideon Elmore, Ed Fogarty, Chuck Foulke, Walter Giesler, Leroy Hankins, Ben Hopwood, Steve Raab, and Roger Wensel. On August 9, 1973, these men met and formally laid out the qualifications necessary for induction, the awards to be given, and the other necessary items to form and to establish the Greater St Louis Amateur Baseball Hall of Fame.

With Don Gabbert elected Chairman, four others, Greg Maracek, Ray Owen, Tom Dix and LeRoy En-

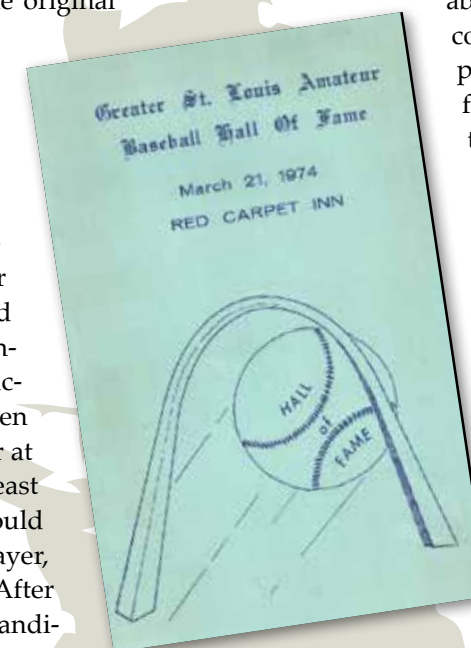

gert, were added along with the original committee to form a diverse Board of Directors that would represent the many decades of St. Louis amateur baseball. In developing the first class of inductees, the Board put forth the guidelines that no Major League player would be nominated for the award and no director would be eligible for the first year's induction. To be eligible for induction, candidates must have been involved in amateur baseball for at least 10 years and must be at least 50 years old. The inductees would fall into three categories: Player, Contributor, and Umpire. After months of reviewing potential candidates and finalizing their selections, 22 individuals were selected for induction at an awards ceremony scheduled for March 21, 1974, at the Red-Carpet Inn.

The Post-Dispatch called that first ceremony "a smashing success." More than 900 people attended the banquet to pay tribute to the first inductees into the new Hall of Fame. Don Gabbert summoned up the turnout by saying, "It just goes to show that this is a tremendous baseball town...It's a tremendous sellout, that's all." The Master of Ceremonies that night was Bob Burnes, sports editor of the St. Louis Globe Democrat, alongside two other guest speakers Bob Buck of KMOX-TV and France Laux, the former voice of the Browns and Cardinals. From its inception, the induction dinner has always been a very special, well attended, and formal evening.

Honored in the first class of inductees were 22 men whose contributions distinguish themselves

- **Bernard (Boobie) Eisenbath** was a shortstop second baseman who spent thirty-one years in amateur baseball including the 1930 and 1931 seasons playing with the House of David team as it toured across the country and even played against Babe Ruth's and Lou Gehrig's New York Yankees.
- **Al Nicolai** was an infielder and pioneer in the early years of the Muny League with the Yucatan Chewing Gum team before managing the Monsanto team for nine years.
- **Bill Daum** was a second baseman who began his over 50 years in amateur baseball with a team

above all others. While having played, coached, or umpired decades ago, we publish this original class so as not to forget their legacy and what it meant to our region. These are the men that set the bar for all those who would later be inducted into the Greater St. Louis Amateur Baseball Hall of Fame:

- **Tony Kreft** a second baseman and shortstop that played on three St. Louis city championship teams and was president of the Heine Meine League.
- **Gus Schulteheinrich** a triple hitting first baseman who played for Wentzville and managed the first St. Charles American Legion team.
- **Harry Meyers** pitched in national amateur baseball from 1929 through 1939 and managed at Fairgrounds Park and in the Khoury League through 1957.
- **Harry Freise** was a third baseman named to three Muny League all-star teams after it was organized in 1913 and also played with the Ben Millers of the Trolley League.

in Centralia, Illinois and was the Khoury Manager of the Year in 1962 for leading the Khoury senior team and the Kutis team in the Ban Johnson League to pennants.

- **Hap Eschenbrenner** was an infielder on seven County League championships (six in Ballwin and one at Manchester) and helped organize the Eastern Missouri Night Baseball League in the 1950s as well as the Ballwin and Manchester Athletic organizations.
- **Tweedy Webb** was an infielder who played on the Tandy League's St. Louis Black Sox, Broomers, and Pullman Shop teams as well as being the area's leading African American baseball historian.

- **John Corcoran** was a shortstop and third baseman that spent eighteen years with the Hellrung and Grims team which competed three times in the national amateur tournament.

In addition to these players in attendance, the following received Sponsors Awards:

- **Thomas Kutis** began picking up the tab for amateur sports in 1930. Today he sponsors sports teams in eight sports.
- **Paul Fultz** managed the Southwest Pros, who traveled more than 10,000 miles across the country playing a challenging 80 game schedule.
- **Martin Mathews** a former amateur baseball star, he formed the Mathews-Dickey Boys Club in 1960.
- **Al Mick** managed 14 years in the Muny League, 12 years in the Heine Meine League and won three pennants and two championships.
- **Mel Schaefer** a player for 17 years, he is a mem-

ber of the board of directors of the ABC League in St. Louis County and headed a fund drive to raise money for St. Louis University's baseball program. Posthumously inducted were:

- **George Khoury Sr.** who founded the Khoury League in 1936 with eight teams. At his death in 1967, the Khoury Association had grown to 50,000 baseball teams, 700 girls softball teams, and 276. Total participants were close to 1,000,000 players.
- **John Scully** a druggist by trade, he devoted his life to coaching young players in the Muny League and the American Legion.

- **Pete Fix** President of the Muny Association and won acclaim as a manager in 1932 when he guided Muny champion Sentinel De Molay to second place in the national tournament.

- **Edgar Loehr** played amateur baseball and later helped organize a team and helped build a field in Ballwin.

- **Roy Newsom** a catcher and a member of the Schenberg Market championship teams of 1922-23-24, while also playing for Frank Smith's Market Championship team in 1925.

- **Francis (Pete) DeLong** one of the most admired and respected umpires in St. Louis amateur baseball history.

- **Vernon Sandusky** an active umpire from 1922-55, he was known as the dean of umpires in St. Louis. He was the director of the Columbus Playgrounds at Tenth and Carr Streets.

At that first ceremony, the precedent of honoring inductees with framed certificates and a unique and special Hall of Fame ring was established. They represent each individual's special contributions to the region's amateur baseball experience. When the organization initially decided they couldn't afford them, Don Gabbert used his salesmanship to convince Falstaff Brewing to underwrite the \$525 cost.

To all inductees, these are rings of honor. To date just over 800 individuals have been inducted in the fifty years of the HOF's existence. When looking back over time and recognizing how many hundreds of thousands and more likely "millions" of people have either played or contributed to amateur baseball over the past century, it truly is a very special honor to be one the few chosen to wear these special rings.

Since that first dinner in 1974, the Annual Hall of Fame Induction Ceremonies have been held in multiple locations ranging from the Henry VIII Hotel on North Lindbergh Blvd at Highway 70 and then down the interstate to the Marriott St. Louis Airport Hotel. In recent years, the Westport Sheraton Chalet has been home to the annual induction and awards ceremonies. The induction dinners have always been a night of dressing up and remembering the past. As shown in the 25th Anniversary program

from 1998, there was much more to these evenings than just dinners and awards. The celebration went on "For Your Dancing And Listening Pleasure" with Russ David and his Orchestra featuring Doty Bennett that would keep the party going from 9:30 p.m. to 12:30 a.m.

How special have these ceremonies been? All you have to do is look at the list of those who have stepped up to the dais to speak at each year's dinner. From Stan Musial, to Enos Slaughter, to Cool "Papa" Bell, and Bob Feller, these are just a few of the biggest names in baseball history that have come to offer their personal stories and memories to the attendees. While nearly a dozen of our speakers received their own induction into Cooperstown's HOF, the others have all have left mark in St. Louis baseball history.

There have been many other changes to the ceremony over the course of five decades. The earlier induction programs were simply a folded sheet of paper with the evening's details and honorees listed inside. Today's programs now exceed 75 pages, printed in brilliant color detailing past inductees and award winners, while also providing special biographies of the current inductee class. To further recognize the legacy of amateur baseball and their achievements within the sport across the region, there has been an expanded roster of awards beyond each year's annual individual inductees. These awards are named after key alumnus of the St. Louis

baseball community and display the testament and dedication of each.

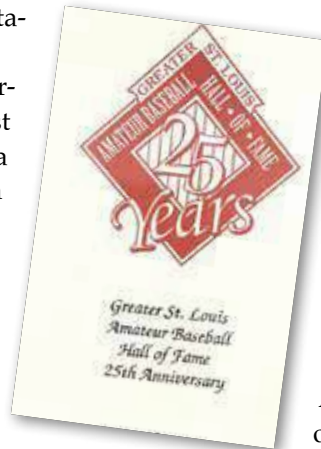
- In recognition of our first Master of Ceremony, the **Bob Burnes Award** was first give out in 2004 to honor a St. Louis area resident for Lifetime Achievement in Professional Baseball.

- The **Bob Broeg Award** was first awarded in 2001 to the high school baseball coach for his commitment to coaching excellence and a lifetime of service to high school baseball in the greater St. Louis area.

- The **Jack Buck Media Award** was first presented in 2004 for service to baseball as a distinguished member of the S. Louis media whose work embodies the principles of Hall of Fame legend Jack Buck.

- The **J. Kim Tucci Legacy Award** was created in 2012 to honor individuals and organizations who are outstanding supporters of baseball in the St. Louis area.

- The **Triple Crown Award** was first awarded in 2023 to recognize an individual who over a sustained period of time has supported the game of baseball and the St. Louis Amateur Baseball Hall of Fame by either financial assistance, sponsorship, or contribution of time and effort.

- In 1996, the **Rising Star Award** was first presented to honor high school baseball players for achievements on and off the field. Each year with five finalists selected from nominations by high school coaches throughout the region. From those five nominees, the Rising Star is awarded to the player who is considered the “best of the best” in the greater St. Louis area.

As we celebrate fifty years of the best of St. Louis amateur baseball tonight, we can say five decades is truly a long period of time. In reality it is not. When considering all the amateur baseball that has been played across the region since the game first came to town after its birth in Hoboken, New Jersey in 1845, the inductees and award winners of this Hall of Fame represent, over time, the best of the best within our region’s game. **Let us all honor those individuals on this stage tonight while also remembering all of the previous inductees and award winners who helped contribute to the legacy of amateur baseball across the greater St. Louis region that helped make ours “the best baseball town in America.”**
